I feel that this is going to be an exciting year at Crystal Springs for many reasons, but among them is Sunday School. This summer we had a great Vacation Bible School at Crystal Springs. It was awesome! More than 20 children had a great time learning about the life of Moses. Thanks to Becky, the Children's ministry coordinator, and to the over 20 volunteers who made this possible. Becky is also planning to have a "Family Night" monthly, especially for the families who have children. It will be a lot of fun and an opportunity to reach out to some young families as well.

STEVE'S VIEW

Wars and rumors of wars. Natural disasters like fire and drought. Political discord. Hunger and disease. A deteriorating culture. Is the Apocalypse not almost upon us? A friend who has become a Jehovah's Witness thinks so.

I do not think we are facing the Apocalypse anytime soon. Predictions of our demise have

at least until now have always been inaccurate. However, we continually are in the position where the world is in terrible shape. For those of us who lived through World War II or the Cold War, for that matter, the world was in a terrible situation. Every generation has their challenges.

Our problems abound with the rise of Islamic power, the resurgence of Russia and the advancement of China, not to mention a sputtering economy and heavy debt.

Who will provide the leadership to sail America's ship through the current mess? Some may disagree, but leadership and competence has been missing over the last seven years. The powers mentioned above have all taken advantage of this vacuum. I'm not just talking about the President. Congress has failed in its duty as well.

The public seems to be in a foul mood. If you are a politician, they apparently do not look favorably on you; witness the rise of Trump, Carson, and Fiorina. Even the Democratic shoo-in, Hillary Clinton, is slowly losing ground. Of course, her scandals with email and her foundation have cut into her support. An indictment might well leave her out of the race.

Some of the other candidates are accomplished and could do a good job, but will they?

The Democrats are really hurting. Hillary has her troubles (self-made as most of her scandals are). Biden may not be ready for a run and the Socialist Sanders, despite the good crowds, will most likely not be able to break through. The best one they really have is Jim Webb, an ex-Republican, who is not well known, even though he has done good things. They are a tired bunch and what we need is a new path.

Are you interested in learning how to quiet your mind and how to become more centered in your daily life?

Centering Prayer Meditation is a simple method of meditation, traditionally called contemplative prayer in Christianity. Contemplative Prayer is the opening of mind and heart – our whole being – to God, the Ultimate Mystery, beyond thoughts, words and emotions. The practice can offer a way to the rest in divine, calm and clarity to these hectic and pressure of daily life.

This introduction to Centering Prayer Meditation includes both instruction and practice in meditation techniques that foster contemplative prayer and practice in your everyday life. During each session there will be a period of meditation followed by group discussion and questions.
